Dear Lemurs Parents and Carers,

Maths



In Maths, we have been learning about shapes with 4 sides such as squares and rectangles. We have been searching for them in the environment as well as sorting them and creating shape pictures. We have also now introduced zero and the children have been working hard to recognise when something is representing zero and have a good understanding of what 'zero' means.





Home Learning: Practise representing numbers from 0 to 5 in different ways. Continue to spot 2D shapes in the environment including circles, triangles, squares and rectangles.

Phonics



We have now learnt all of the Phase 2 sounds including some more digraphs (two letters that make one sound):



We have assessed the children's knowledge of these new sounds and their blending skills and are really pleased with the progress they have made. We are however struggling a little bit with recognising the tricky words so we have sent them home in their reading book wallets for you to play some games with over the holiday.


Literacy



We have read several Christmas related stories in the last couple of weeks including Stickman and The Christmas Pine by Julia Donaldson. For Stickman, the children enjoyed drawing the main character as well as the family tree and writing key words and even a short sentence linked to the storu.

After reading The Christmas Pine, we learnt that it is based on the true story of how Norway gives a Christmas tree to London each year and the children enjoyed learning how to draw a Christmas tree and describe it in their writing.

Understanding the World
