Maths



This week in Maths, we have been learning to recognise similarities and differences between objects, and have been thinking about these keywords: pair, match, sort, same, compare. The children have been sorting colours, matching pairs of socks and also finding pairs and sets of objects within the classroom.







Home Learning: Practise finding pairs and matching items together. You could play a game of snap or a matching game together.

Phonics



This week we have begun learning our first phonemes: s, a, t, p. Please encourage your children to practise these sounds and how to write them using the information below. They will also receive a 'homework' sheet on Monday to recap the learning from this week.

Formation Phrase - s
Down the snake form head
to tail



Pronunciation Phrase - a Open your mouth wide and make the a sound at the back of your mouth a a a

Formation Phrase - a Around the astronaut's helmet and down into space



Pronunciation Phrase - t
Open your lips; put the tip
of your tongue behind your
teeth and press ttt

Formation Phrase - t
Down the tiger and across
its neck




Pronunciation Phrase - pBring your lips together,
push them open and say **p p b**

Formation Phrase - p Down the penguin's back, up and around its head

Literacy



This week we have been reading 'The Colour Monster'. The children have loved learning about the monster's feelings and the different jars he sorted them into. They can name the six feelings such as happiness and calm, and they enjoyed helping me create a new character who wanted to steal the feeling jars. We have been using the sounds we have learnt in phonics to write key words and the children have tried really hard to recall the formation phrases and have also been writing the sounds themselves during phonics lessons. Lots of children helped to colour monster in and enjoyed creating their own feeling jars from junk modelling materials.
