



- Installation of LED lighting in August 2025
- Recycling bins in each classroom, and shared areas.
- Stationery purchased uses recycled paper whenever possible, including exercise books from sustainable sources.
- Locally sourced food purchased whenever available.
- On-site allotment area improving utilised by Year 6 children.
- Woodland Trust provided saplings that we plant annually.
- Improved pool pump and boiler to support more efficient energy use.

Possible Activities - for the Eco Coordinator and Eco Warriors to consider	 Behaviour Campaigns – weekly themed days, class league tables. Walking Bus – volunteer rota, hi-vis vests, risk assessment filed with council. Cycling Infrastructure – weather-proof racks, secure gate, lighting, CCTV linked to office; noticeboard space for maintenance tips. Student Voice – tasting panels choose new recipes; cooking club shares meat-free lunchbox ideas. Local Sourcing – work towards 50 % produce from < 50 mi radius; combine bulk orders with nearby schools. Kitchen Garden – herbs / salad beds managed by Garden Club; produce weighed and logged.
